The Italian Higher Education System

STEP BY STEP



The higher education system in Italy is structured into four different stages:

Undergraduate Degree/Bachelor of Science - B.Sc. (Laurea Triennale o a Ciclo Unico)

Course duration: 3, 5 or 6 years
ECTS/Credit points: 180, 300 or 360

Provides a solid foundation in the core subjects as well as more specialized, professional training. Students holding a 3-year undergraduate degree or Laurea a Ciclo Unico can either enter the job market or continue their studies by applying for a Master of Science or Specializing Master program.

Graduate Degree/Master of Science - M.Sc. (Laurea Magistrale)

Course duration: 2 years
ECTS/Credit points: 120

Undertaken after the undergraduate degree and aims to provide rigorous, advanced training in more highly specialized areas. Enables you to apply for a Ph.D. at any Italian or international university.

Specializing Master (Master Universitario)

Course duration: 1 year
ECTS/Credit points: 60

A professionalizing program providing practical knowledge and training through coursework and internships. These masters programs within the Italian education system do not generally allow access to a Ph.D. program upon completion of the Master. Recognition of the Specializing Master towards a Ph.D. program outside of Italy will depend on local state regulations or individual doctoral programs. Cattolica's English-taught 1-year specializing Master programs include consultancy work projects that may lead to internships/job opportunities.

Doctoral Program - Ph.D. (Dottorato di Ricerca)

Course duration: 3 years
ECTS/Credit points: 180

Undertaken after the completion of a Master of Science or an equivalent graduate degree. It aims to develop the professional competence to carry out high level research in manufacturing and service companies, public bodies and universities.

Course overview

The undergraduate degree in Communication Management (COMMA) is a unique program designed for students interested in learning about communication in the fields of fashion and food, while understanding what role sustainability plays in these sectors, the principles and practice of sustainable development in the context of urban cultures, as well as why the number of food and fashion bloggers is growing. Combining sociology and media studies, psychology and economics, history and political science, together with law, the program provides a coherent interdisciplinary curriculum that allows students to develop their understanding of how communication works in the creative industries and in particular in fashion and food.

Course overview

The Undergraduate program offers a common curriculum during the first two years, aimed at sharing a common background in the fields of economic and managerial sciences. During the first year, students will be provided with a solid foundation in economic and managerial theory, law, mathematics, and economic history. In the second year, the program focuses on the topics from an international perspective. The third year is different for the two programs with each of them focusing on their core subjects.

The School of Economics

The School of Economics is highly valued by its students because of the experience of its academic staff, along with the quality and completeness of its programs. Through teaching and research, and its long tradition, the School emphasizes the value of an economy "at the service of mankind." The School offers an education that balances a core curriculum drawing on a range of independent and interrelated disciplines, and a series of courses that are tailored to understand and keep the pace with a continuously changing world. Students are trained in the fields of economics, law, mathematics/statistics and business.

Course overview

The Food Production Management program provides knowledge and skills for students aiming at managing the different levels of the agri-food chain. Students learn the innovative principles and techniques of agriculture, from the fields to the table, to produce safe, sustainable and high quality food. Focus will be on the supply chains of dairy, cured meats, viticulture, cereals and horticultural produce. In particular, high quality "Made in Italy" products value chains are used as study cases. First year lectures cover the basic statistical, physical, chemical, physiological and genetic concepts through lessons and practical sessions. In the second year, students are introduced to applied studies of microbiology, crop agronomy, cultivation, animal husbandry and welfare, agri-food economics, food technology, traceability, food safety, sustainability and certification. In the third year, the program will broaden to provide a general grounding in the principal features of Italian husbandry (cereals, tomatoes, wine, cheeses and cured meats). The degree study program also comprises an in-company internship and the submission of a final dissertation report that both enhance the students' ability to apply methodologies learnt and knowledge gained to concrete situations. 90% of graduates of the Faculty of Agricultural, Food and Environmental Sciences are employed in relevant companies within one year of graduating, testifying the Faculty's exceptional company ties and the students' outstanding academic preparation.

Career opportunities

Holding a degree in International Relations and Global Affairs allows students to consider a number of different career options: the political, historical and economic skills acquired will be the perfect base for an international career in governmental institutions and NGOs, or in journalism; the grasp of psychology and group dynamics will tailor students for the HR department of large organizations and firms, and quantitative skills will suit graduates for consultancies as well as for international marketing research.

Program-specific entry requirements

Although applications will be evaluated in submission order, high school performance will be one of the main factors in the admission board's decision. IRGA's interdisciplinary curriculum includes a wide range of disciplines: from History to Sociology, from Politics to Psychology, from Economics to International Relations, from Law to Quantitative Methods. This curriculum thus requires entry students to be already familiar with world history, institutions and cultures and to master basic logical, quantitative and analytical tools. International candidates may also wish to submit SAT (evidence based reading, writing and math) or ACT (writing, reading and math) test scores, which will be considered by the admission board and strengthen their application.

Course overview

The Undergraduate Program in International Relations and Global Affairs (IRGA) is a unique program that provides a coherent interdisciplinary curriculum, allowing students to develop their understanding of how people, groups, countries, and international organizations interact in different parts of the world. The program lays sound basis for graduate studies thanks to its focus on political, economic, historic, sociological and legal aspects of complex international issues, as well as on how these disciplines approach, define and analyze international relations. Students are also provided with essential skills to conduct interdisciplinary research and collaboration, and the tools to understanding real world situations.

The School of Political and Social Sciences

The School of Political and Social Sciences has a long tradition as it was one of the first schools to be established at Università Cattolica in 1921, based on the principles of common good, human dignity solidarity and subsidiarity. Its international scope is highlighted by the renowned personalities who have been awarded a *Laurea Honoris Causa*. These inspiring names include Jacques Delors (President of the EU Commission), Javier Pérez de Cuéllar (Secretary General of the UN), Corazon C. Aquino (President of the Philippines) Shimon Peres (President of Israel), Michel Camdessus (Managing Director of the IMF), Helmut Kohl (Chancellor of Germany), Romano Prodi (Italian Prime Minister and President of the EU Commission), José María Aznar (Prime Minister of Spain), Irina Bokova (Director-General of UNESCO).

Single-cycle Degree in Medicine and Surgery

One of the most qualifying features of the Medicine and Surgery program is the complete integration of basic and clinical sciences. This will be achieved through a multidisciplinary approach and an early involvement in patient management, including both ethical issues and legal responsibilities, which are at the basis of the profession. In addition, medical anthropology, bioethics and medical humanities will be emphasized, as well as the ability to communicate with the patient and the family. It will provide a strong specific background, and theoretical and practical preparation in medical practice and methodology, as well as a high level of professional decisions and operational independence in terms of ability to face and solve the main health problems from the preventive, diagnostic, prognostic and therapeutic point of view.

Learning objectives

The program will provide complete integration of learning objectives of European and US curricula. The curriculum includes courses for the International Foundations of Medicine (IFOM) exam. Students will benefit from high quality teaching and learning designed to encourage active participation and support independent thinking. They will acquire the ability to identify the state of health or illness of individuals on the basis of the knowledge of bio-pathology and pathophysiology. In addition they will develop skills and general experience in the field of Internal Medicine, General Surgery, Pediatrics and Obstetrics, as well as Medical and Surgical specialties.

Career opportunities & professional recognition

The program is designed for students who wish to become qualified medical practitioners. A various range of careers are open to medical graduates. Due to the innovative curriculum, students will be able to start a career in both basic and clinical scientific research.

In order to achieve formative goals, the Medicine and Surgery program is organized to offer a total number of 360 University Formative Credits, *Crediti Formativi Universitari* (CFU), spread over a 6-year course. 60 credits consist of activities aimed at acquiring specific professional skills. ADMISSION TEST APPLICATION

In order to be admitted to the test, from October 10, 2019 to February 4, 2020 applicants must comply with the procedure indicated below:

- After submission, in order to finalize their application candidates must pay a non-refundable examination fee of €160 (through an online credit card payment) no later than February 12, 2020.

The program has a maximum capacity of 50 places divided as follows:

EU Citizens


If you are a national from either an EU Member State or an EEA country or you are of Swiss nationality, you should have a European Health Insurance Card (eHIC, Italian acronym: TeAM) obtained in your home country from your national healthcare authority. The European Health Insurance Card (or eHIC) allows you to receive medical treatment in another member state for free, or at a reduced cost. A patient contribution is required for prescriptions, medical examinations, oral and dental care.

Non-EU Citizens

If you are a non-EU citizen you must take out an International Health Insurance which covers costs related to medical treatment and admission to hospital. If allowed by the Embassy/Consulate, you can also buy an Italian national Health Insurance upon arrival to Milan. Cattolica International will provide all necessary forms during the Orientation Events.

Students on all campuses will have access to discounts on public transportation, as well as bike sharing services.

Entry requirements*

Undergraduate requirements

- A high school qualification awarded after a minimum of 12 years of global schooling
- The high school qualification has to satisfy the requirements for access to university-level studies in the awarding country:
 - US Diploma: students must pass 3 AP exams in subjects relevant to the chosen program
 - Canadian Diploma: students satisfy the requirements for access to university as prescribed by each of the 13

Provinces and Territories in terms of both credits and subject combination

- British Diploma: min. 3 A-levels in subjects relevant to the chosen program
- IB Diploma: full diploma with at least one Math exam (SL or HL). Minimum grade for priority admission: 5
- National Diploma: if admission to university-level studies is subject to a special exam in the country where you graduated from high school, you must give evidence to have passed such selection with the required scores
- Medicine and Surgery: above requirements in addition to passing Cattolica entrance exam and rank within the first 30 (non-EU) or first 20 (EU) places according to your nationality

SAT/ACT Tests*

B.Sc. in Economics and Management/ B.Sc. International Relations and Global Affairs: Applicants with high grades in Mathematics will be prioritized. High SAT / ACT scores can also increase chances of admission. Students that do not take Mathematics during their last 2 years of High School are strongly recommended to submit recent SAT / ACT test scores (minimum 560 SAT / 23 ACT in the Math sections).
